Topps Madcaps Pogs 1994 (128)

Oh no! An article on Pogs! O.K. now that five of you are still with me, this is an interesting story worth reading. What if Topps decided to reissue some of the most popular non-sports sets of all time? Sets from a thirty-year span of time from 1963 to 1993 were pulled together to create what Topps dubbed "Madcaps." Flags of the World, Wacky Packages, Dinosaurs Attack and some limited or unreleased projects got a second chance at life as a chromium Pog.

Madcaps were issued in 1994 and came in a strangely shaped foil box. The artwork for the box was by John Pound and featured a kid with a baseball cap slamming a stack of Madcaps. The box had two flaps in the back so the box could be displayed at an angle. A small slot in the bottom of the box would be opened and a customer could fish out a pack of Madcaps. There were four Madcaps inside along with an instruction sheet on how to play Madcaps. Collation was poor. An entire case of four boxes of Madcaps could be bought and not guarantee a full set. Randomly inserted about five per box were slightly thicker Madcaps with a plain cardboard back to be used as slammers. One slammer appears to exist of each title.

There are 128 different Madcaps. The bulk of which are 44 different titles called "America's Ugliest." There are actually 88 titles with an "A" or "B" Madcap with a different background. The images used were from an aborted project called "Ugly Americans" and was painted by Drew Friedman and Pat Piggot. The artwork is similar to 1992's Toxic High. They feature "gross-out" type of humor.

In addition to "America's Ugliest" there are four subsets of eight Madcaps each. By far, the most popular subset is the eight "Wacky Caps." These feature eight images of past Wacky Packages like Blunder and Gadzooka. These Pogs are the reason why unopened Madcaps packs, boxes and cases command a fairly high price today. Rabid Wacky Package collectors tear open pack after pack to search for these elusive Pogs. There are usually between three and nine "Wacky Caps" per box.

The Wacky Caps were not the only Norm Saunder's artwork used in Madcaps. 1963's Flags of the World got another chance to wind up in kids pockets. Eight of these were featured in the set and were simply called "Flags" on the back. The flags featured were the more familiar ones like Canada, France, and USA. Eight stickers from Dinosaurs Attack were also shrunk down to size to fit on Madcaps. These were called "Dino-Might." The last two subsets are more obscure. John Pound painted 17 images for an unpublished non-sport series called "Loco-Motion" These were odd characters on surfboards or skates. The artwork is very detailed and still look sharp on the half-dollar sized Pogs. Finally, there were eight Madcaps depicting images from a John Pound painted series called Stylin Skateboard. These were little stickers that could be used to stick on skateboards. Pog lingo was added to the artwork.

As 1995 came to a close, the Pog fad ended as quickly as it began. One big mystery exists. The slammers are so rare, only a partial checklist exists for them. To date, no Wacky Cap slammer has been found. At least one slammer has been found of each subset. A big "Thank-you" goes out to Terry Gomes for information and Casey Roberson for the checklist.
